Currently, I serve as the Chief of the General Plan Formulation Section of the Planning and Environmental Branch, St. Louis District, overseeing the district's planning program. In addition I am the Lead Planner for Louisiana Coastal Area (LCA) Convey Atchafalaya River Water to Northern Terrebonne Marshes study. This is a critical near-term ecosystem restoration project encompassing over 1000 square miles on the Louisiana Coast. Additionally I am the PM/Planner on an urban flood risk management study in University City, Missouri that is focused on non-structural solutions. I have served as the PM/Planner on multiple high priority projects such as dam safety studies, CAP projects and CG projects at the St. Louis District prior to my current position. Earlier in my career with the Corps I served as an Archeologist and Tribal Liaison for the Vicksburg District.
